

## **Sharps & Medication Disposal**



A used sharp disposal program has been implemented in the Western UP. This program allows residents to bring used syringes, lancets, and other sharps to any Western Upper Peninsula Health Department during regular business hours. There is NO charge for the disposal of your used syringes

- Syringes, lancets, other sharps
- Must be sealed in a puncture resistant container



## Medication

When flushed down the drain, unwanted medicines pollute our waters. Wastewater treatment plants are not equipped to properly filter the medications, causing irreversible damage to aquatic life. You can bring your unused medication to any of the following locations for safe disposal.

- Controlled substances, solid medications
- Keep in original container
- No Liquids
